

Read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Welsh reported a bill entitled, an act to ascertain and fix the salaries of clerks and registers for the several counties in the State ;

Read the first time and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Graves submitted the following preamble and resolution :

Whereas, A meeting of the stockholders of the Farmers' and Merchants' Bank of Baltimore has been called, to take into consideration the condition of said bank ; and whereas, the State of Maryland holds stock in said bank to the amount of fifteen thousand dollars ; and whereas, the State has no representative of her interests in said bank—therefore,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioner of Loans be empowered to represent the stock of this State at the meetings of the stockholders of the Farmers' and Merchants' Bank of Baltimore.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Roberts reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid and confirm the official acts of Charles Wesley Weaver, a justice of the peace in and for Queen Anne's county ;

Read the first, and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The select committee of three appointed yesterday on the subject of the State's tobacco warehouses in the city of Baltimore, was enlarged by adding thereto Messrs. Starr and Allnutt.

The House then took up the bill entitled, an act for the more speedy completion of the Consolidated Lotteries and the augmentation of the State revenue from this source, being the order of the day ;

Read the second time.

Mr. Graves then moved to refer the said bill to the committee on Ways and Means ;

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill,

On being put, it was passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the clerk of the Court of Appeals, to reinstate and place upon the docket of that court a certain case dismissed by said court ;

And to Messrs. Hammond, Owens, Murray, Dorsey and Clarke, to bring in a bill entitled, an act relating to Anne Arundel county.
