The Secretary of State delivered the following communication from the Executive:

STATE DEPARTMENT,

Annapolis, January 25th, 1843.

To the Honorable

The General Assembly:

I have the honor to lay before your honorable body, resolutions of the Legislature of Illinois, respecting the refunding of the fine imposed upon General Andrew Jackson, at New Orleans, in the year 1815; resolutions of the Legislature of Vermont, respecting the "franking privileges and postages;" resolutions of the Legislature of Georgia, upon the subject of repudiation, assumption of State debts, and responsive to the certain resolves of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, against the imprisonment of free negroes, under the laws of those States, which forbid the ingress of such persons within their borders.
