Ordered, That the order instructing the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to inquire into the expediency of limiting the number of magistrates in this State, be referred to a select committee of one from each county and the city of Baltimore, to be appointed by the Speaker, with instructions to report a bill to reduce the number of justices of the peace in the several counties of this State, and to provide for their appointment biennially instead of annually;
