Which was read and concurred in.

Mr Phelps reported a bill entitled, an act more effectually to secure the payment of small debts in this State;

Read the first time, ordered to be printed, and made the order of the day for Wednesday week next, the 8th of February.

On motion of Mr. Roberts,

Ordered, That the committee on Corporations inquire into the expediency of reporting a bill, prescribing a general and uniform mode of creating corporations in this State.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act supplementary to the acts passed at December session 1835, chapters 313, 314, 315, and the supplements thereto;

Read the second time by special order.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Ordered, That the said bill be made the order of the day for Monday next, and that it be printed.

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

Ordered, That it be noted on the Journal that Messrs. Kilgour, Phelps, Yellott, Sutton, Nicols, Owens and Handy of Worcester, a minority of the select committee for dividing the State into Congressional districts, dissent from the report made by the chairman of said committee.
