of a law which shall redress the evils complained of, and whatever

others may exist in the present system.

Resolved, That His Excellency the Governor, be respectfully requested to transmit copies of the foregoing report and resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and also to the Executives of our sister states, with a view to their being laid before their respective legislative bodies.
