This state of things is too oppressive to the companies represented by the undersigned, to be continued, unless the Maryland Rail Road unites with us, and thus enables us to act more efficiently in accomplishing the object in view, viz: that of increasing the income of this whole line of roads, to which end they trust. the Legislature will confer the proper power on the Washington Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, and they ask your favorable presentation of the subject to them, and have the honor to be,
