

THURSDAY, February 2nd, 1843.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members :

The Journal of yesterday was read.

Mr. Graves presented the memorial of John Kipp, Thomas H. Sullivan, and others, of the city of Baltimore, against the repeal of the law providing for the inspection of green hides ;

Read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

Mr. Worthington presented the petition of Richard Brooke, of Montgomery county, praying relief therein mentioned ;

Read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Taylor reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Samuel Dickinson, of Worcester county ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted to withdraw from the files of the House the papers of Wolff Crotoschkin, and others, in relation to pedlars' license.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Graves, Spence, Gallagher, Springer and Starr, to bring in a bill to amend the charter of the city of Baltimore, so as to give to said corporation the right to receive and execute all trusts conferred upon it for purposes of public usefulness.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Powder presented the petition of Henry Lammott, and others, citizens of Carroll county, praying a repeal of the direct tax law ;

Read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

On motion of Mr. Dorsey,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Dorsey, Owens, Murray, Hammond and Clarke, to bring in a bill to authorise Richard C. Hardesty, late collector of the first collection district of Anne Arundel county, further time to complete his collection of county taxes.
