

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That the said bill be recommitted to the committee on Ways and Means.

On motion of Mr. Crain,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill to repeal the third section of the act tentitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province and limiting the extent of them.

Mr. Dorsey reported a bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act, passed Dec. session 1839, ch. 260, granting further time to Richard C. Hardesty, late collector of the first collection district of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collection of county taxes in said district.

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Graves, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise commissioners for Somerset county to appoint a collector of the county levy separately from the collector of the direct tax, reported that the said bill ought not to pass;

Read the first time.

Mr. Hammond, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Sifford of Frederick county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

The House took up the bill from the Senate entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to make a turnpike road from Cumberland to the Pennsylvania line;

Read the second time by special order.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

The following amendment to said bill was read and assented to: Add as an additional section:

Section 11. And be it enacted, That all persons carrying grist to and from mill on horseback, and going to and from church, and jurors and witnesses, summoned to Allegany county court, going to and returning from said court, shall be exempted from the payment of toll on said road.

The question then recurred on the passage of the bill as amended;

And on being put, it passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Phelps,

Whereas, Early in the session of the present Legislature, on motion of Mr. Phelps, leave was obtained to bring in a bill to abolish the High Court of Chancery of this State, and that the said leave was referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice—therefore,
