Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is authorised and required to pay to Mary Allen of Baltimore city, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband, John Allen, during the war of the revolution.

Read the first time.

Leave was granted to Messrs. Owens, Semmes and Sherwood of Talbot, to bring in a bill to lessen the cost of future sessions of the General Assembly of this State.

On motion of Mr. Semmes,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Semmes, Tuck and Hamilton, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to amend an act entitled, an act for the relief of John B. Brooke, clerk of Prince George's county court.

On motion of Mr. Freeman,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Freeman, Semmes and Handy of Somerset, to bring in a bill to repeal an act entitled, an act to encourage the destruction of crows in this State, so far as relates to Charles, Prince George's and Somerset counties.

Mr. Welch reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, with limited jurisdiction, passed at December session 1825, chapter 189;
