

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Langford presented two several memorials of citizens of Somerset county, praying a repeal of the present common school law of said county ;

Read and referred to Messrs. Langford, Rider, Handy of Somerset, and Fleming.

Mr. Buchanan presented the petition of sundry citizens of Maryland, remonstrating against the injurious effects upon the National road, of a certain law, passed by the present Legislature, and praying the repeal of the same ;

Read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

Mr. Graves presented the petition of Wolf Crotoschkin and Lois York, praying relief, for reasons therein stated ;

Read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Buchanan presented the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, asking a repeal of the provisions of a law, passed during the present session of the Legislature, on the subject of the National road ;

Read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

And the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that a law may be passed to regulate the height of fences in the Frostburg district, in Allegany county ;

Read and referred to Messrs. Buchanan, Pickell, Buskirk and Neff.

Mr. Buchanan submitted the following order :

Leave was granted to Messrs. Nesbitt, Grove, Weber, Harne and Boteler, to bring in a bill to limit the number of justices of the peace in Washington county.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Graves, Spence, Gallagher, Springer and Starr, to bring in a bill to reform the organization of the city court of Baltimore.

Mr. Hammond, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the petition of Cyrus Oldham, and others, for the passage of a lien law, reported that
