

of any unappropriated money that may be in the hands of the treasurer of said county;

Which was read the first and by special order second time, assented and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Buskirk, chairman of the committee on Internal Improvement, submitted the following resolution :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioner of Loans of this State, be and he is hereby authorised and directed, immediately to issue and deliver to Thos. Robertson, Sr. of Somerset county, a certificate of debt of the State of Maryland, to the amount of five hundred and eighty dollars, bearing an interest of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually at the loan office in the city of Baltimore, and to be redeemable in fifty years from the date thereof, the same being the sum allowed him by the board of commissioners to settle up the affairs of the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company, (and through the inadvertence of their clerk not included in the award of said commissioners) for right of way, and damages to the lands of said Robertson, by the construction of said road through his said lands.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Causin from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act declaratory of the right of appeal from the judgments or decisions of the county courts of this State;

Read the first time.

Mr. Handy of Somerset, from the committee on Lotteries, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act in aid of the construction of an out let lock of the Tide Water Canal at Bell's Ferry in Harford county, immediately opposite Port Deposit in Cecil county;

Read the first and by special order the second time.

Mr. Yellott then moved to postpone the further consideration of said bill until Tuesday next;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put, it was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Powder from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the benefit of Jacob Grove, late sheriff of Carroll county, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Owens from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act to provide for the repairing or rebuilding a certain bridge therein mentioned, passed at December session 1840, ch. 121, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.
