

On motion of Mr. Graves,

The House took up the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to promote internal improvement by the construction of a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington, passed at December session 1830.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That said bill be referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The House then resumed the consideration of bills entitled to a second reading :

The bill entitled, an act to elect the commissioners of tax of Carroll county by the people ;

Read the second time.

Mr. Powder then moved to amend the said bill by inserting after the word "the" last occurring on the 6th line of the 6th section, the following "county of a person residing in the ;"

On the question being put,

It was determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Lecompte of Carroll,

The following amendment was read and assented to :

Strike out in 5th line of the 11th section the word "State" and insert the word "county ;"

On motion of Mr. Powder,

The 10th section was reconsidered for the purpose of amendment.

On motion of Mr. Powder,

The following amendment was read and assented to : Strike out in the 8th line of the 10th section, the following commissioners district in which the vacancy shall exist "and insert the word "county."

The question then recurred on the passage of said bill,

And on being put,

Was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Sherwood of Talbot moved that the House do now adjourn,

It was determined in the negative.

The House then resumed the consideration of bills entitled to a second reading :

The bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Second German Beneficial association of the State of Maryland ;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Rider,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Presbyterian Church at Barren Creek Spring in Somerset county.

The question being on assenting to the amendments reported by the committee on Corporations to the said bill, and on being put, were assented to.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill as amended, and on being put, was passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning, ten o'clock.
