

Read and referred to Messrs. Hammond, Dorsey, Clarke, Murray and Owens.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

Ordered, That the President of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company report to this House the name or names of any person or persons who have been or are now acting agents of the company, usually called and known by the name of lobby members, and the amount of money which has been paid to any such person or persons by the company—also, the amount of money now claimed by any such person or persons from said company; and that the Presidents of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company and of the Tide Water Canal Company make a similar report respectively to this House.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Yellott, Hopkins, Butler and Jarrett, to bring in a bill to repeal the first section of an act passed at December session 1841, chapter 227, relating to the election of the commissioners of Harford county.

Mr. Lynch reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal the third section of an act entitled, a further supplement to an act passed at December session 1831, chapter 323.

Read the first and by special order the second time.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Ordered, That the said bill be referred to the committee on Colored Population.

Mr. Graves reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Society for the relief of the Indigent Sick;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Graves reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the re-organization of the city court of Baltimore, and for the more prompt administration of justice in said city;

Read the first time, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Risteau, chairman of the committee on claims, to which was referred the petition of Michael Whiteford, of Harford county, praying compensation for services done, as in said petition mentioned, reported unfavorably thereon;

Read the first and by special order the second time and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

Ordered, That the said petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.

Mr. Graves, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Wolff Cretoschkin and Louis York, the sum of fifty-four dollars and seventy-five cents, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury;
