Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act relating to the clerk of Harford county court, reported the same without amendment ;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Lecompte of Carroll, reported a bill entitled, an act to charter a college at New Windsor, Carroll county, Maryland ;

Read the first time.

Mr. Weber from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to regulate the per diem of certain civil officers in Washington county, reported the same with the following amendments :

Amendments proposed.

In the title, after the words "civil officers" insert and "reduce the expenses."

Strike out the second section of the bill, and insert in lieu thereof :

Section 2. And be it enacted, That the act passed at December session, 1834, chapter 325, entitled, an act giving to Judge Thomas Buchanan, a per diem compensation in certain cases, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Strike out the fourth section of the bill, and add the following sections :

Section 4. And be it enacted, That the allowance to judges and clerks of elections shall be three dollars per day instead of the sum now allowed by law.

Section 5. And be it enacted, That the board of commissioners of Washington county shall not allow, or order the payment of any account for fuel, paper or stationery, for the officers of county clerk, register of wills or sheriff.

Section 6. And be it enacted, That nothing in this act shall be construed to affect the existing laws in relation to the itinerant charges of jurors or return judges of elections.

Section 7. And be it enacted, That this law shall go into operation on the first day of May next.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bill passed and returned to the Senate.

The House took up the resolution in favor of Thomas Roberts, Sr. of Somerset county ;

Read the second time by special order.

Mr. Roberts then moved to lay it on the table,

Determined in the negative.
