On motion of Mr. Weber,
Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal, that Mr. Weber declined voting upon the bill passed to-day, entitled, an act to make the printing of the acts of the commissioners of Washington county in two papers, sufficient in all cases, because he believed himself particularly interested.

On motion of Mr. Crain,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Crain, Freeman, Brawner, Key Causin and Thomas, to bring in a bill to regulate executions so far as relates to advertisements of sales by sheriff and constables in Charles and St. Mary's counties.

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to repeal the sixth section of an act entitled, an act to recover small debts out of court and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned, postponed on yesterday until to-day ;

Read the second time.

On the question being put, Shall the said bill pass?

It was determined in the negative.

Mr. Grove reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of David R. Miller of Washington county ;

Read the first, and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Simpers reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Wesley Blake of Cecil county ;

Read the first, and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Buskirk from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise Jonathan Barkdol to close up part of an old road in Allegany county, reported the same without amendment ;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Brawner reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal the fifth section of the act, passed December session 1831, chapter 286, relating to people of color in this State, so far as relates to Charles county ;

Read the first and by special order the second time.

Mr. Morsell moved to refer the said bill to the select committee of twenty-one raised on that subject.

Mr. Brown moved to refer the said bill to the committee on Colored Population.

The House resolved itself into committee of the whole on the bill reported from the committee on Ways and Means by Mr. Murray, entitled, an act further supplementary to an act entitled, an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, passed at March session 1841, chapter 23, being the first order of the day
