

Insert after the word "city," in the tenth line of the third section, "as aforesaid."

Insert after the word "Baltimore," in the second line of the fourth section, "as aforesaid."

Strike out in the same line the words "and required."

Strike out the fifth section of the bill.

Strike out all from the word "Baltimore," in the tenth line, to the end of the said section, and insert "as aforesaid, shall make new appointments in place of those so failing to bond, and continue after every thirty days to fill up said appointments, until collectors shall have given bonds for all collection districts in the State."

Strike out the seventh and eighth sections.

Which were read.
