Mr. Spence reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act vesting certain powers in Baltimore county court, passed at December session 1833, chapter 171;

Mr. Graves reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled an act to direct the manner in which the agents to represent the State in all joint stock companies, in which the State has an interest, shall hereafter be appointed;

Read the first time and made the order of the day for Tuesday next.

Mr. Handy of Somerset, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners for Somerset county, to appoint a collector of the county levy, separately from the collector of the direct tax;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Crampton reported a bill entitled, an act in relation to the payment of State witnesses in Frederick county court.

Mr. Sutton reported a bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled an act to preserve the breed of fish in the waters of the Chesapeake bay, and for other purposes;

Severally read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Pickell reported a bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States road, within the limits of the State of Maryland;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Risteau reported a bill entitled, an act to authorize the commissioners of Baltimore county to place the commissions of the supervisors of all public roads, into the hands of the collector instead of the sheriff;

Which was read the first and by special order the second time.

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert after the word "county" in the second line of the first section, the words "and the commissioners of Cecil county."

The question then recurred on the passage of the bill as amended; And on being put, it was passed.

The title of the said bill was amended by inserting after the word "county," the words "and of Cecil county."

The said bill was then sent to the Senate.
