The House proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the doorkeeper.

The rule being suspended,

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Ordered, That it be noted on the Journal that James Clark, a delegate from Anne Arundel county, is detained from his seat in this House by indisposition.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The House took up the resolution instructing our representatives in Congress to vote for the law refunding to General Jackson the fine imposed by Judge Hall;

Read the second time.

Mr. Phelps then moved to amend the said resolution by adding thereto the following—"provided that this resolution shall not be construed as censuring or impugning the conduct of the late Judge Hall;

Which was read.
