On motion of Mr. Weems,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Weems, Morsell and Allnut, to bring in a bill to repeal an act entitled, an act to consolidate the office of sheriff and collector of the tax in Calvert county, passed December session 1838.

Mr. Owens submitted the following resolutions :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the resolution No. 15, passed at December session 1833, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be authorised to liquidate and pay the postage accounts of the several members of the two Houses now in session, and of their successors hereafter, on all communications and documents received by them whilst in the discharge of their public duties at the seat of government ;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Springer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Springer, Spence, Starr, Gallagher and Graves, to bring in a bill to make penal the disinterring of dead bodies.

On motion of Mr. Welsh,

Ordered, That the Adjutant General be requested to furnish to this House a statement of the number of arms, and kind, received by this state from the General Government, and where they are.

On motion of Mr. Handy of Somerset,

Leave was granted to the committee on Colored Population to bring in a bill to repeal the act entitled, an act relating to the people of color in this state, passed at December session 1831, chapter 281, and the several supplements thereto, as far as relates to Somerset and Caroline counties.

On motion of Mr. Handy of Somerset,

Ordered, That the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice be directed to inquire into the expediency of passing a law staying executions.

On motion of Mr. Holland,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Holland, Hearn, Taylor and Handy of Worcester, to bring in a bill to authorise the citizens of Worcester county to plant oysters in a small bay known by the name of Parker's Bay, which is within the limits of said county, and for the protection of the same.

On motion of Mr. Boteler,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Boteler, Harne, Weber, Nesbit
