The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act vesting certain powers in Baltimore county court, passed at December session 1833, ch. 171.

On motion of Mr. Spence,

Ordered, That the said bill be referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

The bill entitled, an act in relation to the payment of State's witnesses in Frederick county court;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

And the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to preserve the breed of fish in the waters of the Chesapeake bay, and for other purposes;

On motion of Mr. Janney,

Ordered, That the said bill be laid on the table.

Mr. Causin moved to reconsider the vote on the resolution directing the Treasurer to retain, after the payment of the debt due to the banks, the money liable for the payment of interest on the public debt, in the Treasury until the future action of the legislature;

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative. On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The House adjourned until to-morrow half past 9 o'clock.
