Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Semmes,

The said message was amended by striking out all from the word clerk to the end thereof.

The said message was then assented to and sent to the Senate. Mr. Risteau submitted the following message:

> By the House of Delegates, December 27th, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose the appointment of a joint committee of the two Houses of the Legislature, to wait upon his Excellency, the Governor, and inform him that we are ready to receive any communication he may be pleased to make. We have appointed Messrs. Risteau and Simpers to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honorable body;

Mr. Phelps submitted the following message:

Gentlemen of the Senate:
