

Which were read and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Buskirk,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore report to this House a statement shewing the amount of stock held by the State in the several banks of this State, and the market value of such stock in each of said banks.

On motion of Mr. Buchanan,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore of this State, communicate to this House, a list of all the salaried officers of this State, noting opposite each name of each individual, the amount of salary received by such individual—designating particularly, the officers that are created by the Constitution and those that are created by law.

The said Treasurer is further directed to communicate whether any of the officers of this State whose salaries are fixed by law or by the Constitution, receive in addition to said salaries, any commission or perquisite, and what is the probable annual amount arising to such officers from said commission or perquisite.

Mr Handy of Somerset submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That justices of the peace of the several counties of this State, shall not hereafter be furnished with the journal of proceedings of this House or of the Senate, at the expense of the State.

Read the first time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Nicols,

Leave was granted to the committee on Retrenchment, to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to confirm an act to abolish certain offices on the Eastern Shore of this State, passed at December session 1841, ch. 200.

On motion of Mr. Buchanan,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to authorise any one of the judges of Allegany county court as a court of equity, to pass orders of final ratification of sales out of term time, and to provide for holding one or more terms annually in said county for the especial purpose of transacting Chancery business in said county.

Mr. Grove reported a bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of La Grange Lodge, No. 36, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

The House then took up the following bills entitled to a second reading:

The bill entitled, an act relating to out pensioners in Somerset county;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

And the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act for the protection of mechanics and others in Allegany county, passed at December session 1841, chapter 76;
