Leave was granted to Messrs. Risteau, Graves, Randall, Welsh, Walker, Hall, Spence, Gallagher, Starr and Springer, to bring in a bill to repeal an act entitled a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county Court, passed March 7th, 1842.

Leave was granted to Messrs. Risteau, Walker and Randall, to bring in a bill to require the Commissioners of Baltimore county to delivered over the commissions of all supervisors of roads, to the collector of said county for distribution, instead of the sheriff.
