TUESDAY, January 10th, 1843.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

The Journal of yesterday was read.

The Speaker laid before the House a tariff of rates of transportation on the main stem of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, communicated to the House of Delegates, in obedience to their order of the 5th instant;

Read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Also, the reports of the trustees of the Washington academy in Somerset county, of the trustees of Abingdon academy in Harford county, and of the trustees of Deer Park academy in Carroll county;

Severally read and referred to the committee on Education.

And also, the report of the clerk of Calvert county court, in relation to the attendance of judges;

Read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

And also, the report of the same clerk, shewing the amount of money paid by him into the Treasury;

Read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Buchanan presented the petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying that an investigation may be made into the affairs of the Farmers and Millers Bank of Washington county, in Hagerstown, by a select committee of the House of Delegates;

Read and referred to Messrs. Buchanan, Grove Spence, Tuck and Causin.

Mr. Hopkins presented the petition of 92 citizens of the 2nd election district of Harford county, for a law to divide said district;
