SOLD, SERVED OR CONSUMED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES REFORE 1:00 P.M. OR AFTER 12:00 MIDNIGHT ON SUNDAYS.

(4) In Prince George's County there shall be, in addition to the classes herein provided, a special Class B license, known as Class BR, which shall be issued only to restaurants, and for the purpose of this section "restaurant" shall mean an establishment recognized as a restaurant devoted primarily to the regular serving of full course meals to the public that has adequate kitchen facilities and equipment for the preparation of such meals, a dining area not less than 1,000 square feet, that is furnished with chairs, tables and/or booths sufficient to accommodate and seat not less than 100 patrons at one time not including patrons seated at the bar or in the cocktail facilities, if any, wherein the average daily receipts from the sale of food exceeds the average daily receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages; provided further that said restaurant shall submit from time to time, at regular intervals established by the Board of License Commissioners, a statement indicating in detail the ratio of food sales to the sale of alcoholic beverages; and provided further that the capital investment in such restaurant, including fee or leasehold interest in the real estate and in the purchase of furnishings, equipment and utensils, shall be not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00). Applicants for a special Class BR license shall furnish the Board of License Commissioners with such proof as it shall deem necessary indicating the total capital investment in the establishment where it is proposed to locate the said license. Such license shall authorize the holder thereof to keep for sale and to sell at retail any alcoholic beverage for consumption on the licensed premises only. The annual license fee for such special Class BR license shall be nine hundred and forty dollars (\$940.00). Said licenses to be subject to all other provisions pertaining to beer, wine and liquor licenses, Class B, in force and effect in Prince George's County, except that any restrictions against the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays, appearing elsewhere in this Article, shall not apply; provided further that any alcoholic beverages sold on Sunday shall be sold only in connection with meals and in the main dining room and not at the bar or in the cocktail facilities if any., AND IN NO EVENT MAY ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BE SOLD, SERVED OR CON-SUMED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES BEFORE 1:00 P.M. OR AFTER 12:00 MIDNIGHT ON SUNDAYS. A restaurant holding a regular Class B or other class of alcoholic beverage license may exchange its current license for a Class BR license provided it meets the standards contained herein. The Board may permit the exchange authorized under this section without regard to the limit on the numbers of licenses to be issued appearing in Section 53 of this Article. Licenses returned to the Board as a result of the exchange authorized by this section may be reissued by the Board subject to the provisions found elsewhere in this Article.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1965.
