AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 5

"For the purposes of this section the First Legislative District is composed of the area within Wards One, Two, Three, Four, and Five; and within the area of Precincts Seven to Fourteen, inclusive, in Ward Number Six; and of the area within Precincts One to Twenty-nine, inclusive, of Ward Number Twenty-six; and of those portions of Precincts Thirty-seven and Thirty-eight of Ward Number Twenty-six which are situated southeasterly from the center line of Sinclair Lane; and of the area within Precinct Thirty-nine of the Twenty-sixth Ward.";
