Senate Bill No. 5—By Senator James:

Subject: "GENERAL ASSEMBLY," subtitle "APPORTIONMENT."

Senator Pine requested that a written opinion from the Attorney General on the constitutionality on Amendment No. 2 be given the Senate before enactment.

The President said if the request was possible it would be granted.

Senator Mach, duly seconded, moved to reconsider the vote by which Amendment No. 3 was adopted.

Said motion prevailed and the vote was reconsidered.

Senator Mach withdrew Amendment No. 3.

Senator Mach then substituted new Amendment No. 3 in lieu of the original amendment which was withdrawn.

## AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 5

By Senators Mach and Hodges:

In line 14 of Section 42E on page 4 of the printed bill, after the following: "2 Senators." add the following:

"For the purposes of this section the First Legislative District is composed of the area within Wards One, Two, Three, Four, and Five; and within the area of Precincts Seven to Fourteen, inclusive, in Ward Number Six; and of the area within Precincts One to Twenty-nine, inclusive, of Ward Number Twenty-six; and of those portions of Precincts Thirty-seven and Thirty-eight of Ward Number Twenty-six which are situated southeasterly from the center line of Sinclair Lane; and of the area within Precinct Thirty-nine of the Twenty-sixth Ward.";

and in Line 16 after the following: "2 Senators." add the following:

"For the purposes of this section the Second Legislative District is composed of the area within Precincts One to Six, inclusive, of
