AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 10

By Senator Clark:

Amendment No. 1—In line 34 of Section 42E on page 5 of the printed bill, strike out the following: "and 12" and insert in lieu thereof the following: ", 12, and 15"

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Amendment No. 2—Strike out all of lines 40, 41 and 42 of Section 42E on page 5 of the printed bill and insert in lieu thereof the following: "population within any listing, by enactment of the General Assembly of Maryland, but any such enactment shall not affect the election, tenure, powers, or duties of Senators in office at the time the law is"

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Amendment No. 3—In lines 47 and 48 of Section 42E on page 5 of the printed bill, strike out the following: "Senate of Maryland by Resolution" and insert in lieu thereof the following: "General Assembly of Maryland by law"

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Amendment No. 4—In line 56 of Section 42E on page 5 of the printed bill, strike out the following: "Resolution of the Senate" and insert in lieu thereof the following: "enactment of the General Assembly"

Which amendment was read and adopted.
