with our efforts to improve safety on our highways. Under this legislation, motorists with bad driving records would be permitted to continue to operate a motor vehicle in their customary reckless and unsafe manner for an extended period of time, simply by filing an appeal. This would lend itself to the practice of individuals with multiple convictions continuing to drive while the appeals are pending, which, in many instances could conceivably carry over for a considerable period.

This Administration, as well as the present and prior legislatures, has done much to improve highway safety in this State by removing from our highways those motorists whose past driving conduct has indicated that they should no longer be entitled to a driver's permit in this State.

The enactment of this bill, I am afraid, would not be consistent with those efforts.
