House Bill No. 909—Motor Vehicle Registrations

I have today vetoed House Bill 909 and, in accordance with our constitutional provisions, I am returning the same to you along with my veto message.

This bill, as originally drafted and introduced, would have increased the State's revenue by including passenger motor vehicles used for lease or rental in the category of "Class B vehicles."
