INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

House Bill No. 12—By Delegate Goodman:

AN ACT to propose an amendment to Article III of the Constitution of Maryland, title "Legislative Department," by repealing Sections 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 and 7 thereof, and by enacting new Sections 1 through 7, inclusive, in lieu thereof, to stand in the place of the sections repealed, to provide that the General Assembly of Maryland shall consist of a single House, to be called the Senate of Maryland, to provide for the apportionment, tenure, membership and election of the members of the Senate of Maryland, imposing certain duties upon the Governor of Maryland in relation to such apportionment and representation, and relating generally to the Senate of Maryland, and providing for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.
