“(a-1) The membership of the Senate consists of fifty-three (53) Senators. The State is divided into twenty-nine State Senatorial Districts composed and to elect the number of Senators as follows:

- (1) District 1—Garrett County—1 Senator.
- (2) District 2—Allegany County—1 Senator.
- (3) District 3—Washington County—1 Senator.
- (4) District 4—Frederick County—1 Senator.
