Senate Bill No. 11—By Senator Clark:

AN ACT to propose amendments to the Constitution of Maryland, by amending Sections 2, 5, 9, 13, and 15 of Article 3 thereof, title "Legislative Department"; by adding new Sections 5A, 5B, 5C, 6A, and 8 to said Article 3, to follow in their proper numerical order therein; and to amend Section 2 of Article 16 thereof, title "The Referendum," revising certain of the constitutional provisions of the General Assembly of Maryland with particular respect to the apportionment of the representation in the House of Delegates and in the Senate of Maryland and to the laws enacted by the General Assembly and the referendum provisions applicable thereto; providing for the apportionment, membership, and election of Members of the House of Delegates and the Senate and for the Districts which are to be the basis of representation in each of the two Houses; imposing certain duties upon the Governor of Maryland in relation to such apportionment, representation, and Districts; relating to laws enacted by the General Assembly and thereafter placed on referendum; providing for contingencies whereby portions of these constitutional amendments become no longer effective; relating generally to apportionment and representation in the General Assembly, to the election of the Members thereof, to the duties of certain State officers in relation thereto, and to the effect of certain laws enacted by the General Assembly; and submitting these amendments to the qualified voters of the State for adoption or rejection.
