It is reported also that Bayard Rustin may receive compensation from State funds.

The combination of granting this person the forum of a State university and payment from State funds is one that needs prompt and effective investigation. The Senate wants immediately a complete report on the entire matter from the University of Maryland and from the State Police; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of Maryland, That the University of Maryland and the Department of Maryland State Police are directed promptly and immediately to submit to the Senate a full report on the speaking engagement at the University of Maryland for Bayard Rustin, with the University to submit all details about the arrangements for this speech and the State Police to give a full report on the information they have compiled on the background of this man; and be it further

Resolved, That the Secretary of the Senate is directed to send copies of this resolution to Dr. Wilson Elkins and to Colonel Carey Jarman, Superintendent of Maryland State Police, in order that these full and complete reports may be returned to the Senate in time for its consideration at the current Special Session of the General Assembly.

MOTION TO SUSPEND RULES

ORDER

By Senator Malkus from the floor:

Ordered by the Senate of Maryland that for the purpose of considering Senate Bills Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 and all other legislation dealing with the subject of reapportionment of the General Assembly of Maryland, the Senate of Maryland resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole House for their consideration and of the consideration of all other bills relating to the subject of reapportionment of the General Assem-
