Senate Resolution No. 4—By Senator Bertorelli:

Senate Resolution expressing the appreciation and respect of the Senate of Maryland for Christopher Columbus.

The Senate of Maryland in Extraordinary Session on October 12, 1965 pays its respect and appreciation to Christopher Columbus, who discovered the American continents on October 12, 1492.
