**Senate Bill No. 273—Howard County—Motor Vehicles**

AN ACT to add new Section 73A to the Code of Public Local Laws of Howard County (1965 Edition, being Article 14 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland), title "Howard County," subtitle "County Commissioners and County Collectors," to follow immediately after Section 73 thereof, to prohibit burning of automobiles, or parts thereof, within certain limits of property lines within Howard County. AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.
