House Bill No. 1075—Teachers' Retirement System

AN ACT to add a new Section 110(5a) to Article 77 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1965 Replacement Volume), title "Public Education," subtitle "Chapter 8. Teachers' Certificates, Salaries and Pensions," subheading "Teachers' Retirement System," to follow immediately after Section 110(5) thereof, amending the laws concerning the Teachers' Retirement System in order to permit the crediting of membership service, after the payment of certain accumulated contributions, for certain services as a teacher in a private school performing public school functions, and relating generally to the terms and conditions for such membership service credit.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with the provisions of Article 2, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1075.

This Bill would permit a teacher to receive credit in the State Retirement System for certain private school service.

I have been advised by the Director of the Maryland State Retirement System that the State System was established for public
