Subject: "ELECTIONS," subtitle "HOUSE OF REPRESENTA-TIVES."

Amendment to Senate Bill No. 3

By the Committee:

Strike out all of lines 1 and 2, comprising all of Section 3 on page 2 of the printed bill, and insert in lieu thereof the following:

"Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety and having been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which amendment was read and adopted.

Favorable report adopted, as amended.

Read the second time and ordered printed for third reading.

Two-thirds of all the Senators Elect, voting in the affirmative, the rules were suspended by yeas and nays as follows, and the bill was put upon third reading, and final passage.
