

The bill as passed by the Senate of Maryland was amended by the House of Delegates. The Senate refused to concur in the House amendments and asked that the House of Delegates recede from its amendments. The House of Delegates refused to recede, and your Conference Committee was appointed.

The Conference Committee recommends to the members of the General Assembly of Maryland that the House recede from its proposed amendments and that both Houses pass Senate Bill 3 with the following amendment added to the third reading file copy of the bill:

“Amendment to Senate Bill No. 3

Strike out all of lines 1 to 9, inclusive; 1 to 5, inclusive; 1 to 4, inclusive; 1 to 4, inclusive; 1 to 3, inclusive; 1 to 4, inclusive; 1 to 4, inclusive; 1 to 5, inclusive; and 1 to 3, inclusive, comprising respectively all of Sections 166B, 166C, 166D, 166E, 166F, 166G, 166H, 166-I, and 166J on pages 1 and 2 of the third reading file bill and insert in lieu thereof the following:

166B. The State of Maryland is divided into seven districts for the selection of eight Representatives in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States at the primary and general elections to be held in the State in the year 1966 only.

166C. The several districts are numbered respectively from one to seven, and each is entitled to select the number of Representatives indicated for the House of Representatives. All references in this subtitle to election districts and wards are to the boundaries of such election districts and wards as they were on January 1, 1966.

166D. The first congressional district is composed of the counties of Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Harford, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico and Worcester, and those portions of Baltimore County within the boundaries of election districts 5, 6, 7, and 10; one Representative.

166E. The second congressional district is composed of those portions of Baltimore County within election districts 1, 2, 3, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15; one Representative.

166F. The third congressional district is composed of all of Baltimore City except that portion of Baltimore City within the twenty-fifth ward; two Representatives.

166G. The fourth congressional district is composed of Prince George's County; one Representative.

166H. The fifth congressional district is composed of the counties of Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, Howard and St. Mary's and of that portion of Baltimore City within the twenty-fifth ward; one Representative.

166-I. The sixth congressional district is composed of the counties of Allegany, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett and Washington; and of those portions of Baltimore County within election districts 4 and 8; one Representative.
