CHAPTER 41

(Senate Bill 57)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 442(g) of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Supplement), title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "Pistols," correcting an error in the laws respecting the sale of pistols and revolvers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 442(g) of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Supplement), title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "Pistols," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

442.

(g) No dealer shall sell or transfer a pistol or revolver to an applicant whose application has been timely disapproved, unless such disapproval has been subsequently withdrawn by the Superintendent of the Maryland State Police and/or his duly authorized agent or agents or overruled by the action of the courts pursuant to subsection (h) below.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1967.

CHAPTER 42

(Senate Bill 58)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 466 of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Supplement), title "Crimes and Punishments," subtitle "I. Crimes and Punishments," subheading "Receiving Stolen Goods, Money or Securities," correcting an error in the laws respecting receiving stolen goods, money, or securities.
