- (b) No person, other than [a] one duly licensed [medical physician or dentist,] to practice medicine and surgery or dentistry, shall in any manner hold himself out to any other person as being able to prescribe treatment for, or cure the disease of cancer.
- (c) No person, or other than [a] one duly licensed [medical physician or dentist,] to practice medicine and surgery or dentistry, shall in any manner undertake to treat, or prescribe for the treatment of the disease of cancer.
- (d) No person shall sell or offer to sell, or give away, except upon the prescription of [a] one duly licensed [medical physician or dentist,] to practice medicine and surgery or dentistry, any drug, medicine, compound, nostrum or device which is represented by the manufacturer or seller thereof to have curative powers when used in the treatment of the disease of cancer.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1967.
