

House Bill No. 671—By the Prince George's County Delegation.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 153 (k) of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Supplement), title "Alcoholic Beverages," subtitle "Boards of License Commissioners," relating to the number and ~~residents~~ RESIDENCE of the inspectors in Prince George's County and the manner of appointment of and the term of the Chief Inspector.
