

*In no case shall there be less than one teacher to each twenty-five pupils. All schools must be so designated by the name of said school.*

*(b) No postgraduate school of cosmetology shall be granted a certificate of registration, unless it shall employ and maintain a sufficient number of licensed teachers registered as such, and possess apparatus and equipment sufficient for the purpose and full teaching of all subjects in its curriculum and shall secure the approval of its curriculum by the Board.*

*(a) It shall be unlawful for any school of beauty culture COSMETOLOGY to permit its students to practice beauty culture COSMETOLOGY upon the public, under any circumstances, except by way of clinical work upon persons willing to submit themselves to such practice after having first been properly informed that the operator is a student and after the student has completed 500 hours of fundamental training.*

*(b) It shall be unlawful for any school of beauty culture COSMETOLOGY to advertise a list of prices for services to be performed by students other than by posting such a list within the school building.*

*It shall be unlawful for any person to practice cosmetology of any kind in any place other than a registered beauty shop, with or without compensation; provided that nothing in this Act shall prevent duly registered cosmetologists sponsored by a registered beauty shop from practicing cosmetology upon patrons in the residences of such patrons or in hospital and nursing homes by appointment.*

*There is hereby created a board to be known as the "State Board of Cosmetologists." Within 30 days after June 1, 1935, the Governor shall appoint a State Board of Cosmetologists, WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE, consisting of three (3) members. Such members must have at least five (5) years' practical experience hairdressing or beauty culture, COSMETOLOGY, shall be citizens of this State, and shall not be members of nor affiliated with any establishment, firm or corporation manufacturing or selling by wholesale or jobbing any articles, supplies or merchandise, commonly used in hairdressing or beauty shops, and shall not be directly or indirectly connected with any school of beauty culture, COSMETOLOGY, and no two members shall serve at the same time who are graduates of the same school of beauty culture, COSMETOLOGY. The members of the first Board shall serve one, two and three years, respectively, from July 1, 1935; succeeding members shall serve for terms of three years respectively and have the qualifications hereinabove expressed. Within 30 days after July 1, 1968, the Governor shall appoint an additional two (2) members to the State Board of Cosmetologists for terms of two and three years respectively from July 1, 1968; succeeding members shall serve for terms of three years. Said members shall have the same qualifications hereinabove expressed in addition to the requirement that one member must hold a senior teacher's license.*
