the other provisions of this subtitle. Annual renewal fees shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for shop owners, managers, electrologists and school instructors; Two FIVE Dollars (\$2.00) (\$5.00) for cosmetologists, manieurists and , demonstrators; , COSMETOLOGIST AIDES, JUNIOR COSMETOLOGISTS, AND STUDENT COSMETOLOGISTS; and Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for schools of cosmetology. The above fees for registration, examination and certificate shall be paid in advance to the secretary of the Board.

## 550.

The certificates of registration issued in the year in which this subtitle goes into effect shall expire as of the year in which said licenses are issued. Thereafter certificates shall be issued for no longer than one year. All certificates shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next succeeding unless renewed for the next year.

Certificates may be renewed by application on renewal forms to be supplied by the Board on request made prior to the thirty-first day of December of each year, and the payment of the renewal fees provided in this subtitle, said application to be accompanied by an affidavit of a practicing physician on a form to be furnished by the Board, stating that the applicant is free from any contagious and infectious disease, provided, however, that certificates of renewal issued to apprentices JUNIOR COSMETOLOGISTS shall be limited to two in number ONE RENEWAL.

Any holder of a license under the provisions of this subtitle who has been inactive for a period of five years or more shall be required to take and pass an examination prescribed by the Board before a renewal of a certificate of registration is issued.

## *551*.

Every holder of a certificate granted by the said Board, as provided in this subtitle, shall display it in a conspicuous place in his or her principal office, place of business or employment. Demonstrators shall have same in their possession during hours of employment to be exhibited upon demand.

## <del>552.</del>

Nothing in this subtitle shall prohibit service in ease of emergency without compensation, nor service by persons authorized under the laws of this State to practice medicine, surgery, dentistry, chiropody, osteopathy, or chiropractic, nor services by barbers lawfully engaged in the performance of the usual and ordinary duties of their vocation in shops ordinarily patronized by men.

Nothing contained in this subtitle shall apply to railroad companies or to sleeping or parlor car companies, or to persons employed by such companies on their cars.

## <del>553.</del>

An appeal may be taken from any action of the Board relating to licenses to the several circuit courts of the counties or to the common law courts of Baltimore City, otherwise the action of the Board chall be final.
