In conjunction with AS A PART OF the Comprehensive Water Pollution Control Program, the State Department of Health and the Department of Water Resources may cooperate with appropriate agencies for the training of technical and associate level personnel as may be needed in the area of water pollution control. For the purpose of this section, the Health Department with the approval of the Department of Water Resources may enter into contracts with appropriate institutions of higher learning or appropriate agencies to develop the needed curricula and to support training courses. For the purpose of this section, an annual appropriation is authorized, in such amount as provided in the Budget from time to time IN THE BUDGET OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

In conjunction with AS A PART OF the Comprehensive Water Pollution Control Program, the Department of Water Resources and the State Department of Health may conduct studies, surveys, investigations, research and analyses, and may engage consultants to accomplish the purposes of this subtitle.
