

Mr. Newman presented the memorial of the corporation of Cumberland praying the passage of a law confirming the boundary lines of the taxable limits of the corporation of the town of Cumberland, as made by survey under their instructions in August, 1839, in virtue of a law of the General Assembly of 1838, chapter 379, section 2.

Read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Also, a report from the clerk to the commissioners of Allegany;

Read and referred to the Allegany county delegation.

Mr. Long asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act for licensing and regulating ordinary keepers.

Referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Hope asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled an act to alter and amend the Constitution, so as to provide for the election of county clerks and registers of wills more directly by the people.

Referred to Messrs. Hope, Risteau, Biser, Constable and Hook.

Mr. Ridgely asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to abolish magistrates' courts in Anne Arundel county.

Referred to the Anne Arundel county delegation.

Mr. Bramwell asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled an act to define the mode of distributing the school funds of Carroll county.

Referred to Messrs. Bramwell, Hook and Parke.

Mr. Colston asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Talbot county;

Referred to the Talbot county delegation.

Mr. Wilson offered the following:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Esther Williss, one of the legal representatives of Rhoda Wheatly, or to her order, seven dollars twelve and a half cents; being for two months and five days pension, due to said Rhoda Wheatly, at the time of her death, to wit: the 5th June, 1839.

Which was referred to the committee on revolutionary claims.

Mr. Biser asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to alter and amend an act, entitled, an act to provide for electing the justices of the Levy Court in Frederick county, passed December session, 1838, ch. 267;

Referred to the Frederick delegation.

Mr. Sprigg asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to abolish the District Courts in Prince George's county;

Referred to the Prince George's county delegation.

Mr. Martin asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to alter and amend the Magistrates' court law, so far as relates to Talbot county;

Referred to the Talbot county delegation.
