The question then recurred on the adoption of the order by Mr. Holmes, and on being put, it was determined in the affirmative.

The question then in order was upon the substitute offered by Mr. Risteau, for the message offered by Mr. Giles, which was accepted by Mr. Phelps,

When Mr. Mason offered the following as a substitute for the message and order accepted by Mr. Phelps:

Ordered, That all that part of the Governor's message which relates to the banks and currency, be referred to a committee of seven, (appointed by the Chair,) to be called "a committee on the currency," with power to report on the subject to this House, by bill or otherwise.

On the question being put, will the House adopt the substitute? it was determined in the affirmative.

So the said order was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Ordered, That all that part of the Governor's message which relates to the finance of the State, be referred to the committee on ways and means.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Ordered. That all that part of the Governor's message which relates to a convention, be referred to a committee of seven, to be appointed by the Chair, to be called "a committee on the constitution," with power to report to this House, by bill or otherwise.

Mr. Dalrymple presented the memorial of Francis Stevens of Calvert county, claiming a seat in the House of Delegates, and counter to that of James G. Allnutt;

Which was read and referred to the committee on elections.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg,

The House adjourned until to-morrow 10 o'clock.
