dered, in suppressing riots along the line of the canal, and for expenses consequent thereupon;

Read and referred to the committee on claims.

On motion of Mr. Mason,

Ordered, That so much of the Governor's message that relates to the disturbances along the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio canal, in August and September last, and to the expenses incurred in suppressing said riots; together with the accounts of Capts. Barnes and Hollingsworth's troops, for services rendered and expenses incurred on that occasion; be referred to the committee on claims, and that the said committee be instructed to report thereon, at as early a day as practicable.

On motion of Mr. Sutton,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions by county assessment, inquire into the expediency of placing Edward Jackson, of Harford, on the pension roll of said county.

On motion of Mr. Gaither,

Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice, be instructed to inquire into the propriety of reporting a bill to prevent judges of the Orphans' courts of this State, from acting as administrators on deceased estates, unless they be creditors, or the nearest of kin.

Mr. Firor asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, relating to public in Frederick county;

Referred to Messrs. Firor, McPherson and Simmons.

Mr. Newman asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act relating to the division line between Allegany county and Washington county;

Referred to the Washington and Allegany counties delegation. Mr. Bramwell asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of Wolf Bottom Academy, in Carroll county;

Referred to Messrs. Bramwell, Hook and Crabbs.

Mr. Newman asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act relative to invalid deeds and defective proceedings for Allegany county;

Referred to the Allegany delegation.

Mr. Colston asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill supplementary to an act, entitled, an act passed at December session 1834, chapter 304, relating to the public roads in Talbot county;

Referred to the Talbot delegation.

Read a first, and by special order the second time, passed, and

sent to the senate.
