Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Orphans' court of Harford county, be and they are hereby directed to pay, out of the school funds of Hall's cross roads district, to George P. Cook, as assignee of Thomas M. Kennedy, the sum of sixteen dollars and fifty-seven cents, for services rendered by said Kennedy in teaching poor children, in said district during two quarters, ending in February and in April eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, which was duly proven and certified, but was omitted to be presented to the school commissioner for payment before he had accounted with said court.
