Also, a communication from the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Road Company, and the Baltimore and Havre de Grace Turnpike Road Company, shewing abstracts of the accounts respectively of said companies;

Endorsed, referred to the House of Delegates.

Severally read and referred to the committee on corporations.

And returned the bill entitled, an act to provide for recording parts of the proceedings of the commissioners for Somerset county by the clerk of the county court of said county;

The bill entitled, an act to create an additional primary school district in Frederick county;

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act to blend Newtown, Trap and New Freedom in Frederick county, into one, by the name of Jefferson, and to establish boundaries of lots by commissioners and to incorporate the same, passed December session 1831, chapter 299;

The bill entitled, an act to abolish the levy court of Charles county, and to provide for election of commissioners of said county;

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled an act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this State, passed at December session 1825, chapter 162, so far as the same relates to Kent county;
